



CONCERT NEWS AND RULES

As you are all aware our fantastic concert extravaganza is fast approaching. A huge thank you to all those helping.

Our concert has three Acts ... Act 1 & Act 3 are variety performances with many different song and dance themes and Act 2 is our wonderful story ballet, this year called "The Dancing Princesses" (Barbie has a version called 'The 12 Dancing Princesses'). To run an excellent show we need an excellent crew and COMPLETE co-operation from parents and students. This means **ALL SCHOOL RULES MUST BE FOLLOWED**. We cannot and will not tolerate anarchy backstage. All students and backstage crew are to remain backstage for the ENTIRE matinee and evening performances.

Only exception – evening performance: Students in Junior Song & Jazz A, B, C & D classes (whose parents have bought tickets to the evening performance and are already in the auditorium watching the show) can be collected at the completion of Act 1 to sit on their parents' knees to watch the beautiful story ballet, and returned at the end of Act 2 to prepare for the finale. If your child happens to fall asleep whilst on your knee or is too tired to return backstage at the completion of Act 2, they are welcome to remain on your knee for the rest of the show. Any 'Junior Song & Jazz' student who does not have a parent watching the evening performance must remain backstage. We do understand that our 'Junior Song & Jazz' students may not be able to last the entire evening performance – parents of these students only have the option to take their children home at the completion of Act 1.

NO OTHER PARENT is to collect their child/children at ANY other time – serious consequences will be incurred for non-compliance of these rules (including immediate expulsion from the school with no refund of term fees).

All children are well cared for and have a wonderful time both backstage and on stage, meeting and befriending many other students. This is the culmination of a years learning and should be seen as a fantastic and exciting celebration of growth and excellence.
